RF Exposure

General Statement on RF Energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 1.35 W/kg*. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide**.

As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

- * The tests are carried out in accordance with IEC standard PT62209-1.

Body-Worn Operation

Important safety information regarding radio frequency radiation (RF) exposure:

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 15 mm separation from the body.

Failure to observe these instructions could result in your RF exposure exceeding the relevant guideline limits.

Limiting Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Fields

For individuals concerned about limiting their exposure to RF fields, the World Health Organization (WHO) provides the following advice: Precautionary measures: Present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using 'hands-free' devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body.

Distraction

Driving

Full attention must be given to driving at all times in order to reduce the risk of an accident. Using a phone while driving (even with a hands free kit) can cause distraction and lead to an accident. You must comply with local laws and regulations restricting the use of wireless devices while driving.

Operating Machinery

Full attention must be given to operating the machinery in order to reduce the risk of an accident.

Product Handling

General Statement on Handling and Use

You alone are responsible for how you use your phone and any consequences of its use.

You must always switch off your phone wherever the use of a phone is prohibited. Use of your phone is subject to safety mea-

sures designed to protect users and their environment.

- Always treat your phone and its accessories with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to liquid, moisture or high humidity.
- Do not drop, throw or try to bend your phone or its accessories.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or aerosols to clean the device or its accessories.
- · Do not paint your phone or its accessories.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories, only authorized personnel must do so.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to extreme temperatures, minimum - [5] and maximum + [50] degrees Celsius.

Small Children


Demagnetization

To avoid the risk of demagnetization, do not allow electronic devices or magnetic media close to your phone for a long time.

Electrostatic Discharge (ESD)

Do not touch the SIM card's metal connectors.


Antenna



Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

Normal Use Position

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone to your ear, with the bottom towards your mouth.



Air Bags

Do not place a phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area.

Store the phone safely before driving your vehicle.

Seizures/ Blackouts

The phone can produce a bright or flashing light.

Repetitive Motion Injuries

To minimize the risk of RSI when texting or playing games with your phone:

- · Do not grip the phone too tightly.
- · Press the buttons lightly.
- Use the special features which are designed to minimize the times of pressing buttons, such as Message Templates and Predictive Text.
- Take lots of breaks to stretch and relax.

Emergency Calls

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you must never rely solely on any wireless phone for emergency communications.

Loud Noise

This phone is capable of producing loud noises, which may damage your hearing. Turn down the volume before using headphones, Bluetooth stereo headsets or other audio devices.

Phone Heating

Your phone may become warm during charging and during normal use.

Electrical Safety

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit in the battery terminals.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessory.

Only qualified personnel can service or repair the phone or its accessory.

If your phone or its accessory has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service centre.

Interference

General Statement on Interface

Care must be taken when using the phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby.

The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices on board the aircraft, if your device offers a 'flight mode' this must be enabled prior to boarding an aircraft.

Interference in Cars

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

Explosive Environments

Petrol Stations and Explosive Atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment.


Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fuelling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.


Blasting Caps and Areas

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas posted power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.

Getting Started

Starting Up

Installing the SIM/microSD Card and Battery

Power off your phone before installing or replacing the battery, SIM card, and microSD card.


1. Remove the battery cover.



Hold your SIM card with the cut corner oriented as shown below and then insert it into the card holder properly.



Open the microSD card holder, hold your microSD card with the cut corner oriented as shown in the following picture and then insert it into the card holder properly.



Notes:

microSD logo is a trade mark of SD Card Association.

 Insert the battery by aligning the gold contacts on the battery with the gold contacts in the battery compartment on the phone.
 Push down the battery until it clicks into place.



Replace the battery cover and press it gently until you hear a click.



Removing the Battery and SIM/microSD Card

1. Make sure that your mobile phone is powered off.

- 2. Remove the battery cover.
- 3. Pull the battery up and remove it from the mobile phone.
- 4. Pull the SIM card out and remove it from the mobile phone.
- Open the microSD card holder, slide down gently and remove the microSD card from the holder.

Charging the Battery

The new battery is not fully charged. To charge the battery, you need to:

1. Connect the adapter to the charger jack.



2. Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet. Notes:

- If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen and the indicator light will be red.
- When you charge your phone, the indicator light will change according to the battery level:

Indicator color	Battery level	
Red	Less than 10% of the total battery level	
Orange	More then 10%, but less than 90% of the total battery level	
Green	More than 90% of the total battery level	

- If the phone is powered on, the icon will appear on the status bar. When charging is completed, the battery indicator appears on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

Powering On/Off Your Phone

- Make sure that your SIM card is in your device and the battery is charged.
- 2. Hold **Power Key** to power on your phone.

To power off your phone, hold **Power Key** to get the phone options, select **Power off**, and then tap **OK**.

Setting Up Your Phone for the First Time

When you first power on your BLADE after you purchase it or reset it to factory (see *Phone Settings-Privacy Settings—Reset to factory settings*), you need to do some settings before using it.

 Tap Change language/Changer de langue to change the language you want to use, if needed.

- Tap the Android robot on the screen to start the tutorial.
- 3. Tap **Skip** to skip the tutorial, or tap **Begin** to continue.
- 4. View the on-screen instructions and tap Next.
- Tap to Create a Google Account or Sign in your account. You can also tap Skip to set up an account later.
- 6. Configure the Google location options and tap Next.
- 7. Configure the date and time options, and tap Next.

Switching Your Phone to Sleep Mode

Sleep Mode suspends your device to a low-power-consumption state while the display is off to save battery power. Your device also goes into Sleep Mode automatically when you leave it idle after a certain period of time.

Press Power Key to switch your phone to sleep mode.

Waking Up Your Phone

If your phone is switched to sleep mode, you need to wake it up:

- 1. Press Power Key to activate your screen display.
- 2. Drag 🔒 icon to the right.

Notes:

If you have set an unlock pattern for your phone (see *Phone Settings-Security Settings-Protecting Your Phone with a Screen Lock-Set the screen unlock pattern*), you need to draw the pattern to unlock your screen.

Getting Around Your Phone

Using Finger Gestures

You can use finger gestures to control your phone. The controls on your touch screen change dynamically depending on the tasks you are performing.

- Tap the buttons, icons, or applications to select items or to open applications.
- 2. Hold a certain item to get available options.
- 3. Flick the screen to scroll up, down, left, or right.
- Drag a certain item to move it or to do some other corresponding operations.

Tips:

Besides using finger gestures to control your phone, you can also switch your phone screens (such as text input screen, gallery screen, etc.) between portrait or landscape mode by holding the phone upright or sideways.

Home Screen

You can add or remove home items in your Home Screen.



Extended Home Screen

Beyond the screen width, the Home Screen extends to provide more space for adding items. Tap the Dots or slide your finger to the left or right to get the extended Home Screen.

Customize the Home Screen Wallpaper

- 1. Tap Home Key to return to the Home Screen.
- 2. Press Menu Key and select Wallpaper.
- Select Home from the Apply wallpaper to menu. You can also select Lock screen to customize the lock screen wallpaper.
- Select the wallpaper you want to use from Gallery, Live wallpapers, or Wallpapers.
- 5. Tap Save or Set wallpaper.

Add Home Screen Items

- 1. Tap Home Key to return to Home Screen.
- Slide left or right to find an extended Home Screen where there is space to add an item.
- Tap Menu Key and select Add.
 You can also tap and hold the blank area of the Home Screen to get the Add to Home screen shortcut menu.
- Select an item type and the item you want to add to Home Screen.

Delete Home Screen Items

- 1. Tap Home Key to return to Home Screen.
- Hold the item you want to delete until the icon appears on the screen.
- 3. Drag the item to

Wireless & networks	Enables you to configure and manage your phone's wireless connections, such as Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, mobile networks, and Virtual Private Networks. You can also enable the Airplane mode.		
Call settings	Enables you to set up fixed dialing numbers, voicemail, DTMF tones, call barring, call forwarding, call waiting, and caller ID etc.		
Sound & display	Enables you to set sound settings, such as ringtones, notifications, and display settings such as screen brightness and so on.

- Tap Home Key > > Contacts.
- Slide your finger to scroll the contacts list and tap the contact you want to call.

Tips:

You can search for a contact by tapping Menu Key > Search.

Making a Call from Call History

Tap Home Key > > Call log.

Tips:

- Tap a recently dialed or received call from the list. You can scroll down the list to see more call history.
- Tap

Making a Call from a Text Message

If a text message contains a phone number that you want to call, you can make the call while viewing the text message.

- Tap Home Key > Messages and tap the message that contains the phone number you want to call.
- 2. Tap the number.
- 3. Select the number and tap

Making a Conference Call

You can create a phone session between yourself and two or more other parties.

Notes:

This function is subject to your service operator and the network status.

- 1. Call the first number.
- While you are connected to the first number, tap Menu Key > Add call.
- 3. Call the second number.
- While you are connected to the second number, tap Menu Key > Merge calls.
- 5. To add the third party, tap Menu Key > Add call.
- Dial the number, and when connected, tap Menu Key > Merge calls

Making an Emergency Call

- 1. Enter the emergency number for your location from Dialer.
- 2. Tap ______.

Notes:

It is possible to dial emergency numbers when the SIM card is not inserted

Your SIM card may store other emergency numbers. Contact your service operator if you need more information.

Making an International Call

Notes:

This function is subject to your service operator and the network status.

1. Hold 0+ from Dialer to enter "+".

2. Enter the full phone number.

For example: +49-123-12345678 in the following format: + country code-area code-phone number.

3. Tap

Receiving a Call

Answering an Incoming Call

When there is an incoming call, the phone will display the information on the screen.

Drag to the right to answer the call.



Rejecting an Incoming Call

Drag en to the left to reject the call.

Muting a Call

During a call, you can mute your microphone so that the person with whom you are speaking cannot hear you, but you can still hear him or her.

Tap Menu Key > Mute.

When the microphone is turned off, the mute icon was appears on the screen

Putting a Call on Hold

During a call, you can use the following methods to put the call on hold.

Tap Menu Key > Hold.

The micon will be displayed if a call is on hold.

If you are already on a call and accepted the new call, the first call will be put on hold automatically. You can choose to switch between the two callers by tapping **Menu Key > Swap calls**.

Turning the Speaker On/Off

During the call, tap Speaker to turn the speaker on.



The speakerphone icon () appears in the status bar when the speakerphone is on

Ending a Call

During a call, drag to the right to end the call.

Call Settings

You can adjust the call settings of your phone. To open the call settings menu, press **Menu Key > Settings > Call settings** from the Home Screen.

Fixed Dialing Numbers	Enables you to restrict outgoing calls to a fixed set of numbers. To enable this feature you must know your SIM card's PIN2 code.			
Voicemail service	Enables you to select a voicemail service provider.

Contacts

Starting to use Contacts

You can add new contacts along with their information. Setting up communication information for the contact will allow you to call the person quickly or browse the contact's information. Contacts are saved in the phone memory or in the SIM card. If you store the information in the SIM card, you can fill the name and a number. If you store the information in the phone memory, you can also fill out more information including Email, Postal address, pictures, Nickname, website, etc.

Tap Home Key > Fontacts to enter the Contacts Screen.

Contacts Screen

There are three tabs in the Contacts Screen: **Call log, Contacts, Favorites**, and **Groups**.



Managing Contacts

Importing/Exporting Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to you SIM card or microSD card.

Import contacts from the SIM card or export to the card

- 1. Tap Menu Key > Import/Export from Contacts Screen.
- Select to import or export contacts.Your BLADE will automatically read the contacts.
- 3. Select the contacts you want to import/export.

Tips:

- If you want to import/export all contacts from/to your SIM card, tap Menu Key > Select all.
- 4. Tap Done.

Import contact list from the microSD card or export to the card

- 1. Tap Menu Key > Import/Export from the Contacts Screen.
- Select to import or export contacts.If you want to import contacts from microSD card, you should have vCard files saved in the microSD card. If there is more than one vCard file, you need to select the vCard file.
- 3. Tap **OK** if needed.

Creating a Contact

Tap Menu Key > New contact from Contacts Screen.

- 2. Select the location to save your contact.
- Enter the name and phone numbers. You can also set the Email addresses, IM addresses, Postal addresses, Organizations, More etc. if you select to create a phone contact.
- 4. Tap Done to save the contact.

Adding a Contact to Favorites

- Select the contact you want to add to Favorites from your Contacts Screen.
- 2. Hold the contact until a shortcut menu appears.



3. Tap Add to favorites.

Creating a Group and Adding Contacts

- 1. Tap Groups tab from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Tap Menu Key > New Group.
- 3. Input the group name and tap OK.

- 4. Tap the group just created from the group list to open it.
- 5. Tap Menu Key > Add.
- 6. Select the contacts you want to add to this group.
- Tap **Done**.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. Tap Menu Key > Search from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Input the contact name you want to search for.

The contacts matched will be listed.

Editing a Contact

- 1. Select the contact you want to edit from the Contacts Screen.
- Tap Menu Key > Edit contact.

Tips:

You can also edit a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Edit contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

3. Edit the contact and tap **Done**.

Deleting a Contact

- 1. Select the contact you want to delete from the Contacts Screen.
- Tap Menu Key > More > Delete contact.

Tips:

You can also delete a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Delete contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

3. Tap **OK**.

Entering Text

Using the On-screen Keyboard

When you enter a field that needs text or numbers, hold the input box and select **Input method** from the pop-up menu to change input method.

Note: The available input languages on your phone depend on your country and region. They may not be exactly the same as illustrated in this manual.

Android Keyboard

Android Keyboard is a keyboard layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. You can choose to use the landscape orientation of the on-screen keyboard, by turning the phone sideways.



Tips:

- If you want to use the landscape keyboard, you need to select the Orientation check box in Settings > Sound & display.
- The landscape QWERTY keyboard is not supported in all applications.

XT9 Text Input

XT9 Text Input can speed up text input by replacing the letter tapping/typing motion of input with a tracing gesture where you move your finger from letter to letter without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

You can select to use one of the three layouts (Keyboard, Reduced keyboard, Phone keypad) of XT9 Text Input Keyboard.

Keyboard



Move your finger from letter to letter to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.





- Ignore double letters XT9 Text Input will figure those out for you automatically.
- Tap when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and tap.

Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to trace the next word.

Entering Text through the On-screen Keyboard

Entering Text through Handwriting

 Switch to handwriting input mode by tapping the Handwriting symbol on the XT9 Toolbar.



When the Handwriting Input screen displays, write the letters of your word one letter at a time, until your word is complete.



When you are finished with the word, tap the correct word in the selection list, or tap the space character, or draw the following symbol to indicate the end of the word. Other symbols that are available in the handwriting interface are shown below.



Delete Character left.



Delete word left. Use two fingers at the same time.



Delete word right. Use two fingers at the same time.



Uppercase highlighted word or letter. Use two fingers at the same time.



Lowercase highlighted word or letter. Use two fingers at the same time.

Entering Numbers and Symbols

- 1. Enter a field that needs text or numbers.
- 2. Tap 723 / 124 to open the symbol panel.
- 3. Select the numbers and symbols.

Touch Input Settings

You can configure the touch input settings by tapping **Menu Key > Settings > Language & keyboard** from Home Screen.

TouchPal

- Basic settings
- Word prediction: Enables the word prediction function.
- Key press sound: Enables the sound feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Key press vibration: Enables the vibration feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Mixed language input: Enables the language auto-detection if no more than 3 languages are selected.
- > Select languages: Select the languages that you may use.
- Swipe to switch layout: Select to swipe horizontally over the keyboard to switch layout.
- Layout in portrait mode: Select Full QWERTY, 12-Key PhonePad, or CooTek T+ to change the keypad layout in portrait mode.
- Layout in landscape mode: Select Full QWERTY,12-Key PhonePad, or CooTek T+ to change the keypad layout in landscape mode.

- Slide-down symbols: Enables you to input symbols by sliding down on keys.

Android keyboard

- Vibrate on keypress: Enables vibration feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Sound on keypress: Enables the sound feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Auto-capitalization: Select the check box to capitalize the fist letter of each sentence automatically.
- Voice input: Select the check box to enable voice input.

Word suggestion settings

- Quick fixes: Select to correct commonly typed mistakes.
- Show suggestions: Select to show the suggested words while typing.
- Auto-complete: Select to use spacebar or punctuation to insert the highlighted word automatically while typing.

XT9 Text Input

Languages and settings: Select input languages. Tap a language to set up keyboard layout, word suggestion settings, key input settings, trace input settings, and handwriting input settings.

- Preferences: Set up keypress vibration, keypress sound, autocapitalization, and auto-punctuation.
- About: View the XT9 version information.

Messages

Your SMS (text message) and MMS (multimedia messaging service) files are located in Messages (Home Key > Wessages).

Exchanging Messages

From Messages, you can receive and send an SMS or MMS.

When you receive a new message, you can open it from the Notifications Panel, or from Messages Screen. Simply tap on the new message to read it.

The device will alert you for the unread message(s) with the icon







Composing an SMS

- Tap Home Key > > Messages.
- Tap New message.
- Tap To field if needed, and enter the recipient's number, or tap Menu Key > People to select recipients from Contacts.

Tips: You can also enter the first letters of the recipient's name to display a list of matching names stored in Contacts, and then select a recipient from the list.

- Tap Type to compose field if needed, and enter the contents of vour SMS.
- 5. Tap Send to send your SMS.

Composing an MMS

- Tap New message.
- Enter the recipient's number and, if necessary, message text, just like you do with a text message.
- Tap Menu Key > Add subject to enter the subject of your MMS.
- Tap Type to compose field if needed, and enter the contents of your MMS.
- 6. Tap **Menu Key > Attach** to add an attachment to your MMS:

Pictures: Select a picture to add to your MMS.

Capture picture: Take a photo and add to your MMS.

Videos: Select a video clip to attach to your MMS.

Capture video: Shoot a video clip and add to your MMS.

Audio: Select an audio file to add to your MMS.

Record audio: Record an audio file and add to your MMS.

Slideshow: Edit a slideshow and add to your MMS.

Tap Send to send your MMS.

Tips:

- If you add a subject or an attachment to your SMS, the SMS will be converted to an MMS automatically.
- If you remove the subject and attachment of your MMS, the MMS will be converted to an SMS automatically.

Managing Messages and Messages Threads

SMS and MMS messages which are sent to and received from a contact (or a number) are grouped into message threads in the Messages screen. Threaded messages show you exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a specific contact on the screen. Message threads are sorted by the time when you received them, with the latest one on the top.

Reply to a message

- Tap the message you want to reply to from the Messages Screen.
- 2. Tap **Type to compose** and enter the contents of your message.
- Tap Send.

Delete a message (thread)

- Tap Menu Key > Delete threads from the Messages Screen.
- 2. Select the messages or threads you want to delete.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Message Settings

Tap **Menu Key > Settings** from the Messages Screen. You can configure your message settings.

Storage settings

- Delete old messages: Select to delete old messages as limits are reached.
- Text message limit: Set the maximum number of text messages allowed in a single thread.

 Multimedia message limit: Set the maximum number of multimedia messages allowed in a single thread.

Text message (SMS) settings

- Delivery reports: Request a delivery report for each SMS message you send.
- Manage SIM card messages: Manage the messages saved in your SIM card.
- Service Center: Enables you to view and edit the service center.

Multimedia message (MMS) settings

- Delivery reports: Request a delivery report for each MMS message you send.
- Read reports: Request a read report for each MMS message you send.
- Auto-retrieve: Select to retrieve MMS messages automatically.
- Roaming auto-retrieve: Select to retrieve MMS messages automatically when you are roaming.

Notification settings

- Notifications: Select to display message notifications in the status bar.
- Select ringtone: Select a ringtone for your incoming messages.
- Vibrate: Select to make your phone vibrate when receiving a new message.

Using Email

Tap **Home Key** > **Email**. You can enter the Email Screen to setup your Email account and exchange Emails.

Creating an Email account

 Enter your Email address and password, then tap Next when you enter the Email Screen for the first time.



Select the type of your account, edit the incoming server settings, and then tap Next/Next[Check].



If you select **Next[Check]**, your phone will check the incoming server settings and finish the setup automatically. If you are notified that setup could not be finished, you might need to correct some settings to finish it. If there is any problem, please contact your mobile service provider and Email service provider.

- Edit the outgoing server settings and tap Next/Next[Check]. If you select Next[Check], your phone will check the outgoing server settings and finish the setup automatically.
- Set the Email checking frequency, select whether to use this
 account by default or be notified when Email arrives, and then
 tap Next.
- Give your account a name and set a name displayed on outgoing message, and then tap **Done**.



Composing and sending an Email

After creating an Email account, you can compose and send Email messages.

- 1. Tap Menu Key > Compose from the Email Screen.
- Tap To field if needed, and enter the recipient's address.

When you enter the address, the matching addresses saved in your Contacts will be displayed. You can tap the recipient from the list.

Tips:

You can also tap Menu Key > Add Cc/Bc to add recipients.

- 3. Enter the subject and the content of your Email.
- 4. Tap Send.

Reply to or Forward an Email

- Open the Email you want to reply to or forward from Email Screen.
- Tap Menu Key > Reply/ Forward to reply to/forward the Email. You can also tap Menu Key > Reply all to reply to all recipients of the Email.
- 3. Enter the contents/recipients of your Email.
- 4. Tap Send.

Email Settings

Tap the account you want to set from the Email Screen and tap Menu Key > Account settings. You can get the Email settings.

General settings

- Account name: Set your account name.
- · Your name: Set the name displayed on outgoing message.
- Email address: View and change your Email address.
- · Use signature: Select to use signature.
- · Signature: Set your signature.
- Email check frequency: Set the email checking frequency.
- Power-saving mode: Enable the email synchronization time intelligent adjustment.
- Default account: Select the check box to send email from this
 account by default.

Notification settings

- Email notifications: Select to be notified in status bar when Email arrives.
- Select ringtone: Select the ringtone for incoming Email notification.
- · Vibrate: Select to be notified by vibration when Email arrives.

Server settings

- Incoming settings: Set the incoming server settings.
- Outgoing settings: Set the outgoing server settings.

Getting Connected

Connecting to the Internet

Your phone's networking capabilities allow you to access the Internet or your corporate network.

Ways of Connecting to the Internet

You can use the default connection settings to connect to the Internet through your mobile network (GPRS/3G/EDGE), or Wi-Fi.

GPRS/3G/EDGE

Use GPRS/3G/EDGE to connect to the Internet and to send and receive MMS/Email messages on your phone. You will need a data plan to use your wireless service provider's GPRS/3G/EDGE network. Check with your wireless service provider for GPRS/3G/EDGE rates. If the GPRS/3G/EDGE settings are not pre-configured on your phone, contact your operator for the parameters. Do not change the settings as this may cause services to stop working.

Add a new GPRS/3G/EDGE connection

Before you begin, get the following information from your service provider:

- · Access Point Name (APN)
- · Your user name and password if needed.
- Server IP and the port number if the network uses a proxy server

- Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 2. Tap Menu Key > New APN.
- Tap Name to enter you APN name (You can name it as you like).
- Tap APN to enter the APN you want to add.
- Tap Proxy and Port to enter the Server IP and port if the network uses a proxy server.
- Tap and enter Username and Password (If there is no User name and Password, leave them blank).
- 7. Tap and enter APN type if needed.
- 8. Tap Menu Key > Save to complete.

Notes:

If you want to set the APN to default settings, tap **Menu Key > Reset to default**.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet (100 meters).

Turn on Wi-Fi

- Tap Home Key > > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Wi-Fi check box to turn Wi-Fi on.

Add a Wi-Fi network

 Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.

The Wi-Fi network names and security settings (open network or secured network) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.

- 2. Tap a network to connect.
- If you select an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network.
- If you select a secured network, you will need to input the wireless password.

Check the Wi-Fi network status

You can check the Wi-Fi network status from the status bar and wireless controls.

- Check the icon in the status bar.
- Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings, then tap the wireless network that the phone is currently connected to.

You can check the network status from the pop-up window.



Using Browser

You can use your Browser to browse most of the websites. Some web pages may not be displayed properly as some specific web page technologies, such as Flash, are not supported by the phone. Your phone will automatically create an EDGE or GPRS/3G connection for you while browsing web pages.

Opening Browser

Opening Web Pages

In Browser, you can open web pages through the following ways.

- Tap the address bar to enter the website you want to browse, and tap Go.
- Tap Menu Key > Bookmarks and select an item to open.

Select an item from Most visited tab/History tab of Bookmarks Screen.

Browsing Options

- · Refresh: Menu Key > Refresh.
- Go to the next page: Menu Key > More > Forward.
- Add the page to Bookmarks: Menu Key > More > Add bookmark.
- Search: Menu Key > More > Find on page and enter the search item.
- Copy: Menu Key > More > Select text and slide your finger on the page to select the text you want to copy. Your phone automatically copies the selected text to the clipboard.
- Share pages: Menu Key > More > Share page to send a page by Email, Google Mail, Messages, or RoadSync Mail.
- Downloads/page info: Menu Key > More > Page info/ Downloads.
- Landscape browser: Home Key > > Settings > Sound & display. Tick the Orientation box and rotate your phone sideways to view the landscape browser screen.
- Open new browser window: Menu Key > New window.
 Then tap the address bar to enter the website you want to browse.
- Switch browser windows: If you have more than one browser

windows opened, you can switch between these windows by tapping **Menu Key > Windows**. Then tap the page you want to

browse. You can also tap to close a window.

Open a new browser window

- Tap Menu Key > New window to open a new browser window.
- 2. Tap the address bar to enter the website you want to browse.

Switch between different browser windows

If you have more than one browser window opened, you can switch between these windows.

- 1. Tap Menu Key > Windows to view all the windows you opened.
- 2. Tap the page you want to browse.

Tips:

You can also tap to close a window.

Open links in web pages

- 1. Open a web page that contains a link.
- 2. Tap a link to open the page.

You can also hold on the link to open the shortcut menu:

- > Open: Open the web page.
- Open in new window: Open the web page in a new window.
- Bookmark link: Save the link to your Bookmarks.
- > Save link: Download the linked web page to your phone.
- Share link: Send the link by Email, Google Mail, Messages, or Mail.

Copy link URL: Copy the link to the clipboard.

Download applications from web pages

- 1. Open a web page that contains an application link.
- Tap the link or hold on the link and select Save link to download the application to your phone.

Notes:

Downloaded applications are saved in your microSD card.

Using Bookmarks

You can save your frequently-used pages as bookmarks on your phone.

Add a new bookmark

- 1. Open a web page.
- 2. Tap Menu Key > Bookmarks.
- 3. Tap Add/Add bookmark.

Tips:

You can press **Menu Key > List view/Thumbnail view** to change the view type.

4. Enter a name of the bookmark and tap OK.

Bookmarks will be sorted by the time with the latest one on the top.

Edit a bookmark

- 1. Open a Browser window.
- 2. Tap Menu Key > Bookmarks.

- Select an item you want to edit and hold on it until the shortcut menu pops up.
- Select Edit bookmark.
- 5. Edit the name or location, and then tap **OK** to save it.

Delete a bookmark

- 1. Open a Browser window.
- 2. Tap Menu Key > Bookmarks.
- Select an item you want to delete and hold on it until the shortcut menu pops up.
- 4. Select Delete bookmark and tap OK to confirm the deletion.

Browser Settings

You can set the Browser text size, home page etc. by tapping **Menu Key > More > Settings** from a browser window.

Page content settings

- Text size: Adjust the browser text size.
- Default zoom: Set the browser default zoom.
- Open pages in overview: Select to show overview of newly opened pages.
- Text encoding: Select a text encoding type.
- Block pop-up windows: Select to block pop-up windows.
- · Load images: Select to show the images of web pages.
- Auto-fit pages: Select to format the web pages to fit the screen.

- Landscape-only display: Display the web pages only in landscape screen orientation.
- Enable JavaScript: Select to enable JavaScript.
- Enable plug-ins: Select to enable plug-ins.
- Open in background: Select to open new windows behind the current one.
- Set home page: Select to edit the home page web site.

Privacy settings

- Clear cache: Delete all the cached page contents.
- Clear history: Clear the browser navigation history.
- Accept cookies: Select to allow sites to save and read cookies.
- Clear all cookie data: Clear the browser cookies, which will clear all of the history data.
- Remember form data: Select to remember the data you type in forms for later use.
- Clear form data: Clear all the saved form data.
- Enable location: Select to allow sites to request access to your location.
- Clear location access: Select to clear access for all websites.

Security settings

- Remember passwords: Select to save usernames and passwords for web sites.
- Clear passwords: Clear the saved passwords.

 Show security warnings: Select to show warnings if there is a problem with a site's security.

Advanced settings

- Website settings: View advanced settings for individual websites. Only available for some websites.
- Reset to default: Clear all browser data and reset all settings to default.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information within a distance of about 10 meters without any physical connection. The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turning on/off Bluetooth

- Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Bluetooth check box to turn Bluetooth on.

The sicon will be displayed in the status bar. If you want to turn Bluetooth off, clear the **Bluetooth** check box.

Notes:

By default, Bluetooth is turned off. If you turn it on, and then turn off your device, Bluetooth is also turned off. When you turn on your device again, Bluetooth turns on automatically.

Making your device visible

Other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can detect your phone, establish a partnership, or use a Bluetooth service.

- Tap Home Key > > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Select the Bluetooth check box if needed.
- 3. Select the **Discoverable** check box to make your device visible.

Change your device name

- Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Select the Bluetooth check box if needed.
- 3. Tap Device name.
- Enter the name and tap OK.

Pair with another Bluetooth device

You can pair your device with another device that has Bluetooth capabilities. Once you do this, the two devices must have Bluetooth turned on but do not need to be visible for you to exchange information between them.

- Tap Home Key > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- Tap Scan for devices.

Your BLADE will display all reachable Bluetooth devices in the **Bluetooth devices** section.

- 3. Tap the device you want to pair with.
- 4. If necessary, type your PIN to pair and tap OK.

Tips:

The same PIN should be entered on the other device.

Experiencing Multimedia

Camera

Your phone comes with a 3.2-megapixel camera that lets you capture sharp pictures.

Opening Camera

Tap Home Key > **Example 2** > Camera to open the camera.

Notes:

You can switch from the camera to the camcorder quickly: Drag the switch up.

Taking Pictures

Aim the camera at the subject and then tap on to take the shot.

- Tap the picture in the right corner of your Camera Screen to view the picture just captured.
- Tap Menu Key > Gallery to view all of your pictures.

Camera Settings

By tapping **Menu Key > Settings** from the Camera Screen, you can adjust the camera settings.

Camera settings

 White balance: Tap to adjust the white balance. White balance enables the camera to capture colors more accurately by adjusting to the current lighting environment.




